Body Part	Ability	Act	Period of time
Eyes	see	look at	watch
Ears	hear	Listen!	listen to

They all have nouns, too.

In fact, they even have adjectives!

noun	verb	adjective	Examples:	
sight	see, look, watch	good-looking	You've got a good-looking bunch of kids.	
hearing	hear, listen to	good-sounding	Martin makes a good-sounding guitar.	
sense of taste	taste	tasty	Tiramisu is a tasty dessert.	
sense of smell	smell	smelly	Put those smelly socks in the hamper, please.	
sense of touch	feel, touch	sensitive	Your skin is sensitive enough to feel the sun.	

Does that make sense?
